3. How to facilitate training excellence and maintenance of skills:

- b. trainers to attend the ‘train the trainers’ courses (establish such kind of courses across Europe)

- c. is the advanced course necessary for all trainees?
- d. ESPGHAN should provide some help in supporting young fellows to attend such courses
- e. Find out current state of training assessments across Europe to determine baseline.

4. Main training centers with specific equipment in Europe :

Training centres – Proposal around the concept of “ESPGHAN national training centres” and “ESPGHAN International training centres”. Produce a document detailing standards that should be met by all training centres that train trainees. Additional standards for the International training centres that could train ESPGHAN fellows, run courses etc. Once document and standards agreed – to organise a pilot assessment starting with units running courses already.

- b. Will discuss possible ESPGHAN endoscopy certification process at next strategy day with the education committee.
- c. Potential to develop roles for ESPGHAN assessors who have done a TTT to provide summative assessments for trainees
